Marina Overview



Electricity

Electricity is provided at each berth. Please use the electricity outlet as instructed by the marina team.

If you do not have the correct adaptor for the socket size available, please contact the marina reception. We have a small number of adaptors available to loan. The adaptor should be returned to a member of the marina team as you depart through the lock. Adaptors are loaned free of charge, but a cost of replacement will be applied to your bill, if the item is lost or damaged.

Electricity connections are provided by the marina at the user's own risk and it is a user's responsibility to ensure they have the suitable fitting for their on board system.

Please see the price list for current marina charges for electricity costs. More details on getting connected can be found on page 24.

Water

Drinking water is available from the taps on the marina pontoons. If you do not have a long enough hose or the right connection, please contact the marina office and we will endeavour to help. Please use water considerably and return any loaned equipment to marina reception as soon as it is no longer required.

Rubbish

Green rubbish bins for domestic waste and blue bins for recyclable material are provided at all pontoon exits. If you have large items, or international catering waste, or oils and lubricants to dispose of, please contact the marina reception. These must be disposed of separately.

Security

You will have receive access cards for the pontoon gates and our facilities. Please put these against the electronic card readers at the side of the gates or door and push the door or gate. The card readers are lit by a blue light, which turns green when access is allowed. If you have any difficulties using your card, please contact the marina reception.

In the event of an emergency, there is an emergency door release underneath the card reader.

Washrooms

We have two sets of washrooms for marina users. We have 6 washrooms located in the marina reception building and a floating unit of 5 washrooms in the north west corner of the East Dock. Each set of washrooms have facilities for disabled users. Please use your access card to enter these.

We regularly inspect our washrooms for cleanliness. Please let us know if you find anything not as it should be.

Marina trollies

Marina trollies are available at most pontoon exits. They require a £1 or €1 coin to release them.

Laundry

Two self-service, coin-operated washing machines and dryers are available in the laundry room in the marina reception building. A standard wash is £3 and £1 gives 30 minutes of drying time. We do not provide washing detergent. There is an iron and ironing board also available for use.

Waste water pump outs

Please do not dispose of waste water into the marina. Waste water pump outs, operated by the marina team, are available at almost every berth. Please contact the marina reception to organise a time and confirm the current charge.

ATM

There are cash ATMs at the Tesco and Waitrose supermarkets, and in The Tower Hotel reception.

Mail

There is a post box on Marble Quay (at the south east corner of the Centre Basin) and another in Thomas More Square.

Conditions of mooring

A copy of our full conditions of mooring is available from the marina reception or through our website. Please note that swimming, fishing and boat repairs with power tools are not permitted in the marina.

Securing your boat

We recommend at least two bow lines and a stern line when mooring bows-in (vice versa for stern-in). At least one line should go to the perimeter pontoon. Please do not adjust the position of the cleats. If you need assistance please contact marina reception.

Wildlife

The marina is home to a variety of species of water birds and fish. A wildlife trail details these, with a series of information boards displayed around the marina perimeter.

Preparing to Leave

Whilst you may have just arrived, please take a few moments to familiarise yourself with the procedure for your departure.

Booking a lock-out time

Please contact the marina reception during the day before your departure to organise your lock out time. We will ask for your preferred departure time but, please be flexible as we are obliged to group yachts together to optimise the locking time available.

The lock operates approximately 2 hours before and 1½ hours after high water (London Bridge) between the hours of 0600-2030 during the summer season (April - October) and 0800-1800 in the winter season. All locking operations must be completed in these times.

Payments

Payment by debit and credit cards. We do not accept cash, cheques or American Express credit cards.

Your access cards and any loaned equipment will be collected by our team after you have secured your boat in the lock.

Locking Out

About 15 minutes before your lock out, one of our Dockmasters will make an announcement on VHF Ch 80 and confirm the vessels involved in the lock out and a preferred order for entering the lock.

If you require a bridge to be lifted or opened, this will also be confirmed. As you will remember from your arrival, there is a floating pontoon on the eastern side of the lock. If the lock is busy, you may be asked to raft alongside another boat, or tie up to the wall on starboard side and adjust your lines as the water level changes.

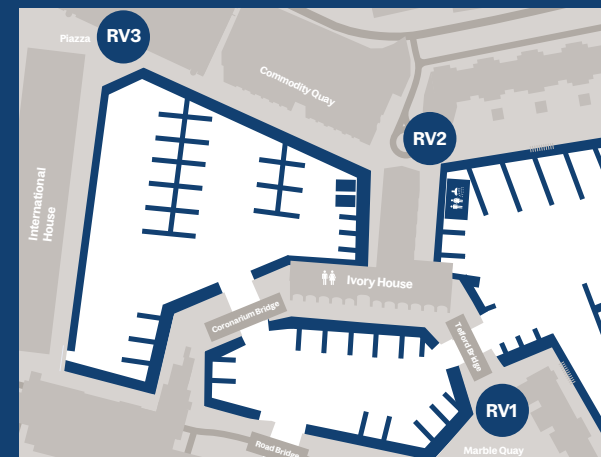

History

Charm 200 years in the making

Opening in October 1828, St. Katharine Docks was designed by Thomas Telford and was once one of the busiest ports in the UK. Replacing what is described as a '24-acre slum', a hospital and a community of 11,300 people were moved on for its creation. Its name, St. Katharine, derives from the hospital and church that previously resided at the site. The Docks were renowned for handling trade in luxury items such as sugar, rum, spices, perfumes and wines, with over 32,000 tons of tea passing through on a yearly basis. Trade of items, including ivory, continued into the early 20th century.



Unfortunately, the Docks were badly damaged during The Blitz, with most warehouses in the east side of the Docks destroyed, and its basins became disused. However, during the late 1960s, a development saw the docks morph into a haven, which evolved into a modern marina development in the 1990s. A berth boosting renovation in 2017 saw a reconfiguration of pontoons and an increase in capacity.

St. Katharine Docks is now London's largest marina, comprising of 520,000sq ft of office, retail and residential properties. It provides 185 berths in three basins and can accommodate vessels up to 40 metres long. Two surviving warehouse buildings provide glimpses into 19th century dock life, and that iconic picture-postcard marina backdrop; the timber-framed tavern, The Dickens Inn, and Ivory House, with its elegant clock tower, named after its controversial cargo.

Thames Marine Services (TMS) operate the fuel barge Heiko on the river, moored less than 500m downstream of the marina's lock entrance. TMS operate at similar times to our lock times but you are advised to book ahead.

By prior arrangement and for large quantities, TMS will also visit the marina with their smaller vessel. To organise this please contact TMS directly.

Exploring London



Tube/DLR

The nearest underground station is Tower Hill, and is served by the District and Circle lines. Tower Gateway station is also just a short walk away and served by the DLR (Docklands Light Railway). National Rail and Elizabeth Line services are available from Liverpool Street Station which is a 26-minute walk. The cheapest travel available is by using an Oyster Travelcard or a contactless bank card. Visit the marina reception for a tube map or collect one at Tower Hill station.



Riverboat

Cruise boats and river ferries run from Tower Bridge Quay (previously known as St. Katharine's Pier) and Tower Pier respectively. Cruises can be booked through Crown River Cruises. Thames Clippers (Uber Boats) provide ferry travel to Greenwich and West London from Tower and London Bridge City piers.

Taxis

There is a taxi rank at the reception area of the Tower Hotel, near the lock entrance. Taxis are normally available 24hrs a day.



Cycling

Santander Cycles is London's self-service, bike-sharing scheme for short journeys. There are 3 bike docking stations nearby at Tower Hill Station, and in St. Katharine's Way at Waitrose.

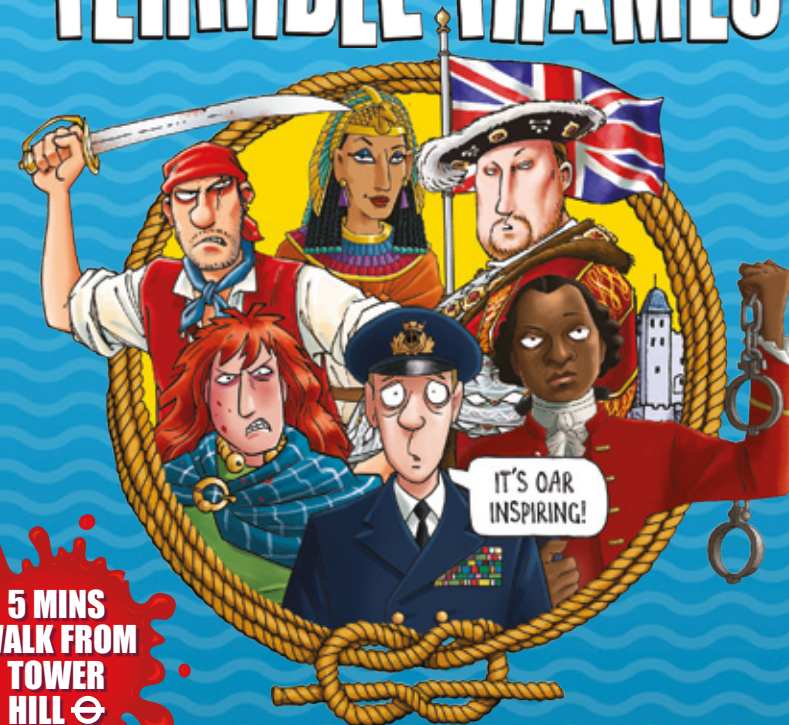

Metered Electricity

A metered electricity socket is provided at each berth. You have been provided an electricity account for the duration of your stay, and you will pay for the electricity you have consumed, when you depart the marina.

To connect to electricity
Plug in to your allocated socket numbered

Go to the nearest keypad pedestal

On the keypad, enter **# _ _ _ #**

Wait for the display to confirm the socket is on. If you remove your plug, you will need to re-establish the power connection by following the instructions above.

To get a balance enquiry on the pedestal display, key in the same 4-digit code, but with an * either side.

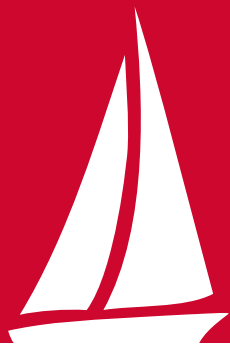

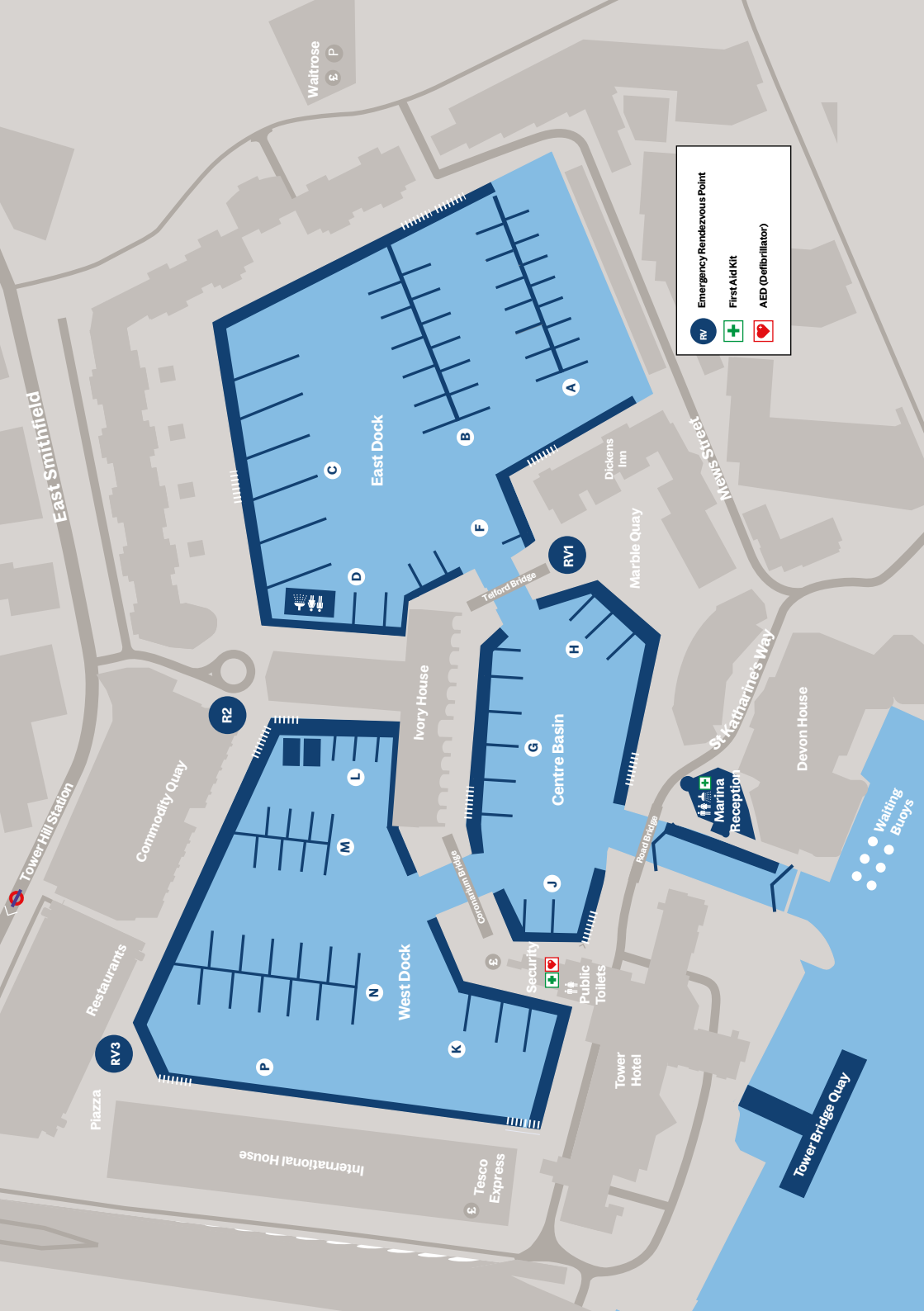
